# **ECO 105 Principles of Microeconomics**

#### 3 Credits. 3 Lecture Hours. 0 Lab Hour.

Study of basic concepts of microeconomics. Topics include: supply and demand, equilibrium processes, consumer choice, firm pricing and output behavior, industry structure, government antitrust regulation, externalities, economic welfare, and income distribution.

Prerequisites: AFL 085 and AFM 090 or appropriate placement test score

## **ECO 110 Principles of Macroeconomics**

#### 3 Credits. 3 Lecture Hours. 0 Lab Hour.

Study of the economic macro-system. Topics include: analysis of inflation and unemployment, government monetary and fiscal policy, aggregate income analysis, consumption, savings and investment, long run growth policies and budget deficits, foreign trade flows, and exchange rate polices.

Prerequisites: AFL 085 and AFM 090 or appropriate placement test score

# **ECO 198 First Year Special Topics in Economics**

# 1-9 Credits. 0 Lecture Hour. 0 Lab Hour.

A course on selected topics related to Economics, which gives students opportunities to study information not currently covered in other courses. Grades issued are A, B, C, D, or F.

# ECO 199 First Year Independent Project in Economics

#### 1-9 Credits. 0 Lecture Hour. 0 Lab Hour.
