Finance Technology (FIN)

The Finance Technology program offers two tracks that lead to finance-related careers.

- The General Finance track prepares students to work with individuals, businesses, or government agencies involved in raising, spending, and investing money. Core courses provide the skills required for many career paths in finance.
- The Financial Planning track focuses on personal financial management including cash flow management, insurance, investments, taxes, retirement and education funding, and estate planning. The Financial Planning track is available as a fully online degree program.

Financial Planning Certificate (FPC)

The Financial Planning Certificate prepares graduates to develop comprehensive financial plans for clients by applying knowledge and skills in a variety of personal financial planning areas, including taxes, investments, insurance, and retirement and estate planning.

The certificate program is designed for individuals with a bachelor's degree in any field who want to provide professional financial planning services.
