### **Associate of Science (ASCI)**

The Associate of Science degree is designed for students who plan to transfer into a bachelor's degree program immediately after completing their Cincinnati State degree.

The Associate of Science degree includes the Ohio Transfer Module, which is a core set of general education courses, along with directed electives that allow students to complete the first two years of a fouryear degree in a natural sciences or physical sciences field. Working closely with an academic advisor, students customize the curriculum to fit the school and the bachelor's degree program they plan to complete.

Students in the Associate of Science program participate in cooperative education, which offers opportunities for internship or employment in a career-related field. The co-op or internship placement provides practical training and enriches the academic experience.
