The department offers one Associate of Applied Business degree program:

- The Automotive Service Management (ASM) (<http://catalog.cincinnati.edu/academicdivisionsanddegreeandcertificateprograms/businessesstechnologiesdivision/automotive/asm/>) program includes co-op education at local automotive service companies as well as classroom instruction.

The department also offers five certificates:

- The Automotive Service Technician Certificate (ASTC) (<http://catalog.cincinnati.edu/academicdivisionsanddegreeandcertificateprograms/businessesstechnologiesdivision/automotive/asm/>) is prepares students for entry-level jobs in the technical area of automotive service field.
- The Automotive Engine Repair Technician Certificate (AERTC) (<http://catalog.cincinnati.edu/academicdivisionsanddegreeandcertificateprograms/businessesstechnologiesdivision/automotive/aertc/>) prepares students for starting or advancing their career in the automotive service industry as an engine repair technician.
