IDD - Intellectual & Developmental Disabilities

Courses

IDD 105 Introduction to Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

3 Credits. 3 Lecture Hours. 0 Lab Hour.

A course on fundamental concepts in the study of intellectual and developmental disabilities (IDD). Topics include: history, definitions, legal rights, identification and treatment options, behavioral interventions and trauma-informed care, community services, life transitions, and the impact of culture in the lives of individuals with IDD.

Prerequisites: Placement into ENG 101A

IDD 110 Community Services for Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

3 Credits. 3 Lecture Hours. 0 Lab Hour.

An introduction to IDD community services and resources. Topics include: professional roles, referrals, early interventions, education and employment options, community living, assistive technology, social inclusion, and supporting diversity.

Prerequisites: Placement into ENG 101A

IDD 115 Legal Rights and Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities

3 Credits. 3 Lecture Hours. 0 Lab Hour.

A course on legal rights and intervention strategies for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Topics include: disability law, rights and empowerment, abuse and neglect, ethics, Medicaid and Ohio waivers, early intervention, Individual Family Service Plans (IFSP), Individualized Education Plans (IEP), and protection of diversity in the IDD community.

Prerequisites: IDD 105

IDD 190 Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities Practicum 2 Credits. 1 Lecture Hour. 7 Lab Hours.

Students seeking the IDD Certificate participate in an unpaid offcampus learning experience integrated with academic instruction. Students must follow applicable policies and procedures to earn credit. Grades issued are Satisfactory or Unsatisfactory.

Prerequisites: IDD 105 and IDD 110
